Lung Cancer is the leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States.

Lung Cancer causes 30% of all cancer deaths.

Lung Cancer is the leading cancer killer among Caucasians, African Americans, Asians and Hispanic males.

Lung Cancer will kill more people this year than:

- Breast Cancer
- Prostate Cancer
- Colon Cancer
- Liver Cancer
- Kidney Cancer
- Melanoma...combined!

Lung Cancer will kill 3 times as many men as prostate cancer this year.

Lung Cancer will kill nearly twice as many women as breast cancer this year.

Over 50% of new lung cancer cases will be diagnosed at a very late stage-Stage III or IV-and only 5% of them will live for 5 years.

10-15% of new lung cancer cases are people that have never smoked.

In 2005 the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) budgeted \$204 million for breast and cervical cancer research, \$14 million for prostate cancer research, and \$14.6 million for colon cancer research. The 2005 budget for lung cancer research was \$0.00.
